

1st International Congress of Ege Social Sciences Graduate Students

Ege University Institute of Social Sciences was established in 1982 in order to train postgraduate scientists and experts in the fields of social and humanity sciences, as well as to carry out qualified scientific studies. In the past 40 years, 6701 postgraduate students graduated from our institute's programs, 990 are from PhD programs and 2300 are from master's programs with thesis. Ege University Institute of Social Sciences, with its deep-rooted history, is organizing the first international postgraduate student conference in the field of social sciences as of 2022.

The aim of our congress is to enable graduate students working in the field of social sciences to present their studies within the scope of an international academic organization and to meet with academics in their fields, on the 40th anniversary of the establishment of Ege University Institute of Social Sciences. In this context, academicians will operate the sessions as to their fields. Our congress will be held online, considering the pandemic conditions.

Participation in our congress is free of charge. Congress languages are Turkish and English. In case of sufficient number of applications, a session will be established for papers in German. The quota for Turkish papers is limited to 40%. All abstracts sent to our congress will be subject to peer review. Papers which are deemed appropriate by the referees in terms of content, scientific and spelling rules will be entitled to present at our congress. An abstract book with ISBN number containing all the presented papers will be published. Full text submission is optional and submitted full texts will be published in the full text proceedings book with ISBN number.

Participants can participate in the congress with a maximum of 1 paper as a single author or co-author. A certificate of participation will be sent via e-mail to all the presenters of the congress. Papers may have been prepared in one of the following fields. Our congress is also open to interdisciplinary studies.

- The person making the presentation must be a graduate student.
- Presentation language can be Turkish, English or German.
- Presentation time is limited to 15 minutes.

- For your abstract to be published in the abstract proceedings book, an oral presentation must be made at the congress. (Abstract template is at the bottom of the page.)
- Full text submission is optional. (Full text template is at the top of the page)

Abstract

Abstract text should be written in Times New Roman, 12 Punto and 1.5 line spacing. Abstract text should have minimum 150 and maximum 300 words. Paragraphs should be aligned as justified. Page size should be A4 and the margins should be 2.5 cm.

Keywords: Please indicate 5 keywords

1. INTRODUCTION

In this section, general information about the subject should be given. The purpose, research question and the main outlines of the study should be explained.

2. MAIN HEADINGS

Sub-headings should be written in 12-pts Times New Roman font, all in capital letters. The number of subtitles may vary according to the content of the study.

2.1. Subheadings

Subheadings are given in 12 font size, Times New Roman font and italics. The number of secondary sub-titles may vary according to the content of the study.

Tables should be prepared by the author and should not be placed in the text as screenshots or images. At the beginning of the table, the title of the table should be given in 11-pts and bold. The source must be specified at the bottom of the table and must be 10-pts in size.

Figures (all kinds of visual materials) should be prepared by the author. If the figure is quoted from any source, the source must be specified below. If it is a copyrighted figure, permission must be obtained from the author(s) of the work. The title of the figure should be 11-pts and bold. The source must be specified under the figure and must be 10-pts in size.

3. CONCLUSIONS

A synthesis of the main findings of the study should be presented in this section. In line with the findings, discussion or policy recommendations should be included.

REFERENCES

APA 6 reference styling should be used. This section should be written in Times New Roman font, 12-pts.

GENERAL RULES

- English abstracts must be included in studies written in Turkish and German.
- All text should be written in Times New Roman font. Titles should be 12 pts, text 11 pts, references under tables and figures must be 10 pts. The texts in the tables should also be in 10 pts size.
- All text should be prepared with 1.5 line spacing.
- The full text can be a minimum of 5 and a maximum of 15 pages, excluding the references.
- The full text file must be in DOC or DOCX format.
- APA 6 in-text citation rules should be adopted for the sources used in the text.
- The list of references should be prepared according to APA 6 criteria. Few examples for the APA 6 style are given below. For more detailed information, you can visit <https://apastyle.apa.org/style-grammar-guidelines/references/examples>.
